Bergen is the gateway to the Fjords of Norway. As a UNESCO World Heritage City and a European City of Culture, the Bergen region has the ideal combination of nature, culture and exciting urban life all year around.

With **its** ideal location right in the heart of the Fjord Norway region, between the Hardangerfjord and the Sognefjord, it is the perfect starting point for day trips to one of the world's biggest scenic attractions – the fjords. From Bergen you are real close to the spectacular fjord experiences, either you want to go on a fjord cruise or dive into the experience with mountain and glacier hiking in the majestic mountain landscape, **skiing** in some of Norway's best terrains, biking along the beautiful fjord arms or explore the wet element with white water rafting or fishing in the ocean along the beautiful coast line.

The Norwegian fjords were formed through several ice ages as the sea carved itself through and across the coastline, leaving a beautiful landscape with snow-clad mountains, blue glaciers, deep gorges, cascading waterfalls and tiny fertile villages strung like glowing green pearls along the fjord line. DIFFERENT TYPES OF SCHOOL

Schools across England are funded and managed in different ways and will vary depending on the age of your child.

Schooling at different stages?

School Type	Description
A-Nursery schools	Nursery schools are stand-alone schools for children aged three and four. They have their own head teacher and staff. Some are state-funded, others are privately run (although your child might be eligible for a free part-time place).
B-Nursery classes	Nursery classes are attached to primary schools. They may have a separate building and playground away from the main school but share the same headteacher and staff.
C-Primary schools	Primary schools serve for children aged 4-11. While at primary school, children start with the Early Years (Foundation) curriculum, followed by Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 of the National Curriculum.
D-Specialist schools	State secondary schools often specialise, which means they have an extra emphasis in one or two subjects. Schools can specialise in: the arts, maths and computing, business and enterprise, music, engineering, science, humanities, sports, languages, and technology.
E-Special schools	Pupils at a special school have usually been assessed and given a statement of special educational needs (SEN). These may include learning disabilities or physical disabilities. Some special schools are funded by the local education authority. These could be community, voluntary-aided or controlled, or foundation special schools. Some special schools are independent .
F-Secondary schools	Secondary schools serve for children aged 11-16 or 18. They take pupils through Key Stages 3 and 4 of the National Curriculum.
G-Sixth form colleges	Sixth form colleges serve for young people aged 16-19. Students study for A levels (Obtaining A Level or equivalent qualifications is generally required for university entrance) and other qualifications that you can do after the age of 16.

State or private education?

Regarding compulsory education, all children aged 5-16 are entitled to a free place at a state school. Most families take up this place. A few – around 6.5% - choose to pay for a place at an independent (also called a private, or – confusingly – public) school. Parents pay fees towards the cost of running an independent school.
